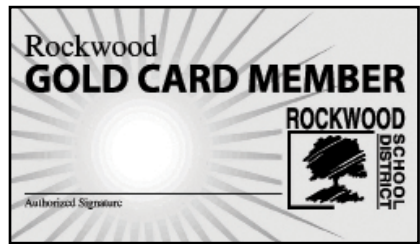

Rockwood Community Education is proud to offer Swim America, a state-of-the-art, learn to swim program developed by the American Swim Coaches Association that is goal driven and technique oriented. All instructors are trained and certified by the Swim America site supervisors.

Swim America is taught in ten stations:

Station 1: Bubbles

Station 2: Floats & Glides

Station 3: Kicking

Station 4: Crawl Stroke

Station 5: Freestyle

Station 6: Backstroke

Station 7: Breaststroke

Station 8: Butterfly

Station 9: Lifetime Strokes

Station 10: Individual Medley

Swim America teaches more than just how to swim. Proper techniques are emphasized, with attention given to correct body position, movement of arms and legs, breathing and timing of the strokes. In all stations, the students will focus on safety, fitness, health and fun.

Each new student will be evaluated and placed in the station that best suits their ability. A returning student will be placed in the station they were working on at the end of the last session. The site supervisor will track each student's progress and station placement. Please remember that all students learn at a different rate. After station ten of the Swim America program, the student will be able to swim 300 yards of freestyle and be proficient in all four Olympic Strokes: butterfly, backstroke, breaststroke and freestyle. They will also have the skills necessary to join the Rockwood Swim Club, one of the premier USA swim teams in the country.

Refund Policy: A \$3 processing fee will be charged for all refunds. You must call and cancel at least five business days prior to the start of class to receive a refund. Refunds will be given at the end of the session if a class is cancelled. **There will be no make-ups if you are unable to attend a class.**

Private Learn to Swim Class

For all ages of swimmers who feel they will progress faster with one-on-one instruction. Please see schedule and fee amounts on pages 8 - 9.

Parent/Child & Preschool Programs
