1. Students will be able to express and exchange information on a variety of basic topics
2. Students will understand ASL exchanges signed in a variety of basic topics
3. Students will perform simple stories, songs in ASL using conceptually accurate signs and will follow ASL grammar
4. Students will understand basic historic development of ASL and appreciation of Deaf Culture
5. Students will understand and use body language and facial expressions when communicating on a variety of basic topics
6. Students will be able to understand Deaf Culture and compare it with Hearing Culture
7. Students will use ASL both within and beyond the classroom setting.
8. Students will learn the alphabets and be able to Fingerspell and comprehend Fingerspelling

## Learning targets for ASL 2

1. Students will exchange ideas and opinions to provide and obtain information from each other
2. Students will understand ASL exchanges on an expanded variety of topics
3. Students will perform more complex songs, stories using conceptually accurate signs and grammar
4. Students will demonstrate deeper knowledge and appreciation for Deaf Culture
5. Students will discuss the importance of body language and facial expressions in Deaf culture and compare with Hearing culture
6. Students will compare and contrast spoken English and ASL in detail
7. Students will continue to build their confidence and ability in using ASL both within and outside of the classroom
8. Students will continue to develop their Fingerspelling skills
