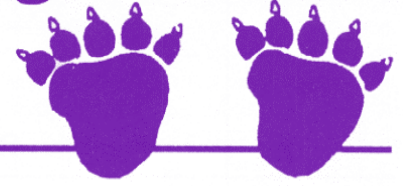

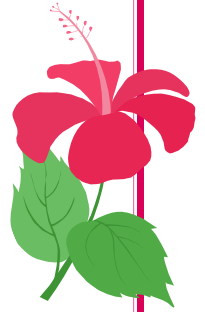

NURSE'S NOTES

**Nurse's Notes**

Can we reach you in an emergency? Please be sure to keep LSMS informed of changes in your cell and work phone numbers. As the school year progresses, I find the numbers in the system are very often obsolete. Your child is always allowed to call you from the nurse's office if they are ill or injured—*a/ways*. Middle school students are not allowed to make cell phone calls—even to parents—while school is in session.

Wheezing and Sneezing! This season can be challenging for kids coping with allergy or exercise-induced asthma symptoms. Rockwood nurses recently participated in the St. Louis Regional Asthma Consortium Summit, a state-of-the-art update of asthma management skills and knowledge. The use of a prescribed quick-relief inhaler *before* exercise is generally effective to avoid asthma symptoms. The NIH Expert Guidelines are clear: if your child uses an inhaler more than twice a week for symptom relief [not including preventive use before exercise], this generally indicates inadequate asthma control, and a check-up is in order. We have the capacity at school to assess peak flow, FEV1, and oxygen saturation. This real-life data is invaluable to your doctor in evaluating your child's overall asthma plan. Call for a copy to take to your next appointment.

Fitness and PE! Physical Education is a required component of the middle school curriculum. Research shows a clear correlation between fitness and activity. If your child is unable to participate in PE for medical reasons, Rockwood requires documentation from your doctor. Generally speaking, any injury that side-lines your young athlete for more than a day or two [of PE or their outside team sports] needs to be evaluated by a doctor. We'll work closely with you to implement a safe plan for school, based on your child's health status.

Immunization Reminder: Students entering 8th grade are required to have a Tdap booster. If you received a letter about missing shots, please call and let me know your child's status before school is out. This will help avoid *lots* of unnecessary phone calls over the summer! Any time your child gets any vaccine, be sure to send an updated copy to school.

Physical Reminder: A doctor's exam is required by Rockwood for incoming 6th graders and every year for high school activities. If your freshman plans to participate in any high school athletics next year including sports, cheerleading & poms, he/she will need a **physical dated after February 1, 2011**.

Medication Reminder: Any medications remaining in the nurse's office at the end of the year must be picked up by an adult before the last day of school, May 27. Oral meds *cannot* be sent home with students. If your child has an inhaler or EpiPen at school, please call to make arrangements. Meds cannot be kept for next year. Unclaimed meds will be discarded promptly per federal regulations!

Whew—that's lots of rules and reminders! The most important message is to eat smart, play hard, and be well. Healthy kids learn better, and that's why we're all here!

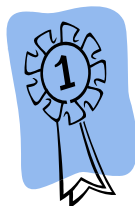

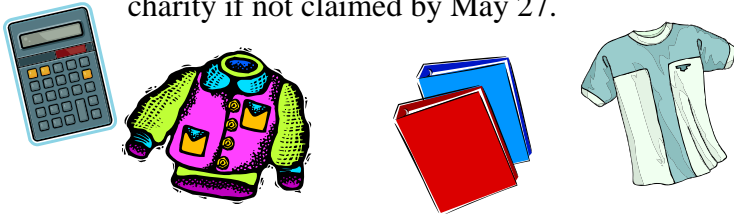
