During the conference, you might ask the teacher questions about how your child is getting along with others, about class participation and preparation, about any changes in behavior or study habits and areas that may need improvement and how you can help.

Following the conference, be sure and share information with your child, work together to set goals, and let him or her know how proud you are of his/her accomplishments. Our mission is the same as yours, to bring success to all our children. Thanks for sharing your family with us!

Health Screenings



Vision Screening will take place on November 2 & 3 for 6th and 8th graders

Hearing Screening will take place on November 18 for 7th graders.



Parents will be notified by mail of any need for further evaluation. If you have concerns about your child's hearing or vision, please let me know!

Illness

The basic guidelines have not changed—if you are sick, stay home! If your child has had a fever in the past 24 hours, do not send him/her to school. Symptoms of headache, sore throat, or cough need to be watched closely. Check for fever—this year, even a modest temperature elevation should be monitored at home.

Physicals

Rockwood requires a doctor's exam for all students entering sixth grade, as well as students of any grade level who are new to the district. Parents are al-



lowed thirty days from the start of school to get this accomplished—time's up! **Students who have not turned in a middle school physical will not be allowed to participate in after-school intramurals or district athletic events.** If you need assistance to find a doctor or clinic in your area, please call.

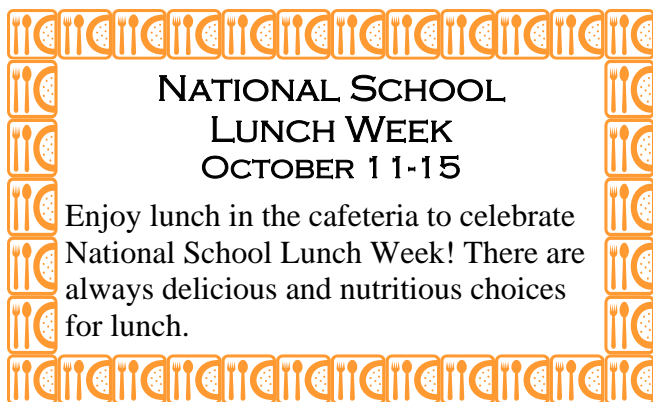



Rockwood is providing all middle school students with free e-mail accounts through a Microsoft program called Live@edu. These e-mail accounts will be used to support middle school curricular requirements and enable increased communication with teachers.

Two other additional benefits to Rockwood students are:

- Students will have a Rockwood e-mail address with 10 Gigabytes of storage space which will enable them to more readily transport files from home to school.
- Students will be able to re-set their password for Infinite Campus through an email notification reducing the amount of time students spend during class on the phone when they forget their password to Infinite Campus.
- Teachers will be able to use the messenger system within Infinite Campus to communicate with students.

Rockwood Technology Staff have the ability to view messages sent or received by students if there is a concern about message content. Messages with inappropriate language will also be blocked from transmission.

If you do not want your child to have an e-mail address through Live@edu, please send your request to noemail@rockwood.k12.mo.us. You will need to send your request from the e-mail address listed in Infinite Campus for the parent or guardian. You can make this request at any time, but access to the e-mail addresses will be granted after October 15, 2010.

Student-Tutor Connection for Rockwood Families

TutorConnection is a Rockwood program that helps connect certified Rockwood teachers

and professionals with parents who are looking for private, fee-based tutoring lessons for their children. The focus is to improve students' knowledge and skill-based performance of the district's curricular concepts ~ academic, music, physical education and driver's education.

How much does TutorConnection cost?

Rockwood, in cooperation with teacher representatives from the Rockwood National Education Association (RNEA), has determined a fee for one-on-one tutoring at \$49.50 per hour, with a two-hour minimum purchase (\$99 for 120 minutes). Small-group tutoring options (maximum 3:1 ratio) may be available at a reduced fee in some subject areas.

How does the program work?

Parents can go online to view a list of all tutors available on the Community Education website. Once parents select the tutor, they can purchase tutoring minutes using a credit/debit card or online check. Tutors will contact parents directly to set final tutoring times in Rockwood schools that are most convenient for the student, family and teacher.
