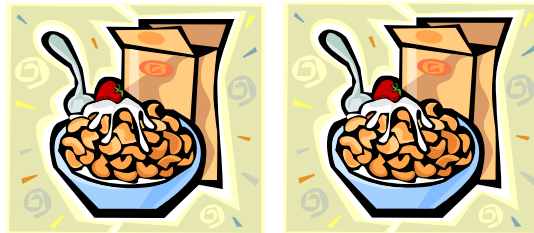

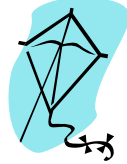


Summer Office Hours

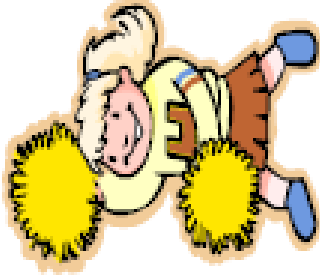

Thank you Rockwood Voters! Prop 5 Passes ~ What's Next?

Nearly 11,000 Rockwood voters endorsed a check for \$55 million when they approved Prop 5 during the April 6 elections. Here is what stakeholders can expect to see during the next two years of this bond issue cycle:

In June 2010, Rockwood's bond advisors will sell the bonds competitively. Since these are AAA bonds, they are very attractive. A list of prospective bidders is formed and the bidder with the lowest interest rate will be awarded the bonds.

Once the bonds are sold, Rockwood has the funds needed to begin working on the school project list with contractors.

Rockwood's construction management company works with the district's facilities department to plan and design the work; facilitate the competitive bidding process; and award contracts for the various projects.

Administrative Center: 733-2000

On April 29, the Rockwood Administrative Center is replacing its aged phone system, which means the school district's main office will change its phone number to (636) 733.2000.

The district's central office and related departments located at 111 E. North Central will replace the aged/at capacity telephone and voice-mail system with Voice over IP technology that includes 911 service.

PARENT FAQs about End-of-Year Math Assessments

Is the end-of-year assessment based on current year concepts or next year's concepts?

- The End-of-Year Assessment that all students take is a comprehensive test of the concepts they were taught throughout the current school year.

My child is already accelerated, what test will they take?

- Students who are already accelerated one (or more) grade levels in math will take the End-of-Year Assessment for their current math placement.

Where can I find a list of grade-level math concepts?

- All of the concepts taught are listed in the curriculum document on the website. Go to the link below and you will find elementary math documents on the right side of the webpage.

When will we know the results of the end-of-year assessment?

- If your child qualifies for additional testing, you will receive notification within a week of the End-of-Year Assessment. If you do not receive notification and would like to know your child's results, please contact your child's teacher.

What is the format and duration of the assessment?

- The assessments have multiple choice and short answer questions. There are multiple opportunities for students to show their problem-solving skills on the assessment. In most cases tests are about 35 questions at each grade level and total approximately 50 points. Although there is not a strict time limit, the tests were developed to take approximately 45-60 minutes. Teachers have been instructed that they may break the test in two smaller testing sessions if needed.

If my child qualifies for additional testing, how can I prepare my child for that test?

- As with the End-of-Year assessments, students are not expected to study for or prepare specifically for this test. If you would like to see the concepts that may be on that test, go to the link mentioned in answer to the second question and look at the grade level above your child's current placement.

Will my child have an opportunity to retest?

- Students have one opportunity to take the End-of-Year assessment. If a student is absent the day the test is administered, they will be given a make-up opportunity before May 15.

Can I see my child's completed test?

- For test security and validity reasons these tests will not be sent home or shown to parents. Teachers have been instructed that they may share a list of concepts missed with parents. However, actual questions from the assessment will not be shown to parents.

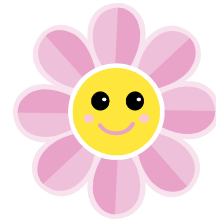
